REGULAR VERBS	IRREGULAR VERBS
<b>E.g.</b>	<b>E.g.</b>

**Think about some verbs you can use  
when you are talking about daily routines.**

# PAST SIMPLE TENSE



\*Actions finished in the past.

\* Series of completed actions in the past.

On regular verbs add -ed to the verb, on irregular verbs the structure changes.



I visit Berlin.

First, I get up, then I have breakfast.

I **visited** Berlin last week.

First, I **got** up, then I **had** breakfast.

# PAST SIMPLE TENSE (AFFIRMATIVE +)

**S + V Past Simple + C**

	Present Simple	Past Simple (+)	Example in Past Simple
Regular Verb	I cook pasta in the afternoon.	I <b>cooked</b> pasta in the afternoon.	
Irregular Verb	She wakes up at 7 o'clock and she buys a coffee.	She <b>woke</b> up at 7 o'clock and she <b>bought</b> a coffee.

**S + Auxiliary + not + V Inf + C**  
**[did]**

	Present Simple	Past Simple (-)	Example in Past Simple
Regular Verb	I cook pasta in the afternoon.	I <b>didn't cook</b> pasta in the afternoon.	
Irregular Verb	She wakes up at 7 o'clock and she buys a coffee.	She <b>didn't wake</b> up at 7 o'clock and she <b>didn't buy</b> a coffee.

## PAST SIMPLE TENSE Affirmative (+)

S + V Past Simple + C

	Present Simple	Past Simple (+)
Regular Verb	I cook pasta in the afternoon.	I <b>cooked</b> pasta in the afternoon.
Irregular Verb	She wakes up at 7 o'clock and she buys a coffee.	She <b>woke</b> up at 7 o'clock and she <b>bought</b> a coffee.

## PAST SIMPLE TENSE Negative (-)

S + Auxiliary + not + V Inf + C  
[did]

	Present Simple	Past Simple (-)
Regular Verb	I cook pasta in the afternoon.	I <b>didn't cook</b> pasta in the afternoon.
Irregular Verb	She wakes up at 7 o'clock and she buys a coffee.	She <b>didn't wake</b> up at 7 o'clock and she <b>didn't buy</b> a coffee.

## PAST SIMPLE TENSE Interrogative (?)

Auxiliary + S + V Past Simple + C ?  
[Did]

	Present Simple	Past Simple (?)
Regular Verb	I cook pasta in the afternoon.	<b>Did I cook</b> pasta in the afternoon?
Irregular Verb	She wakes up at 7 o'clock and she buys a coffee.	<b>Did she wake</b> up at 7 o'clock and <b>did she buy</b> a coffee?
