Present Simple vs Present Continuous

Differences

PRESENT SIMPLE

- Repeated actions (habits, routines).
- A permanent situation.
- To say that something is true/untrue in general.
- It is normally used to talk about THOUGHTS, FEELINGS AND STATES.
- "Always" means "Every time".
- To describe main events.
- For facts. E.g., Tomorrow is Tuesday.

USED FOR FUTURE

- An official arrangement such as a timetable or programme.

PRESENT CONTINUOUS








- Something happening at the time of speaking. The action is not finished.
- A temporary situation.
- To talk about changes, developments & trends.
- It is mainly used for actions and happenings. It's not usually used for states. (These verbs aren't used in continuous tenses: like, love, hate, be, prefer, know, suppose, mean, believe, understand, seem, etc.).
- "Always" means "Too often".
- To background events.










USED FOR FUTURE

- A personal arrangement.
