PAST SIMPLE

 Activities finished in the past (Usually including a time frame).

Example:

- You went to the mountains last weekend.
- They found a river in the forest yesterday.

The students were studying

when the power went out. 9 am 10 am The students were studying. The power went out.

Activities started and finished in the past.
 Emphasizing duration.

Example:

- She was travelling all night long.
- You were looking for your earring all morning.

 Ongoing actions in the past, interrupted by a sudden event.

Example:

- It was eating, when the other dog arrived and stole its food.
- We were hiking when it snowed, so we had to come back home.


