*They are words that describe verbs, adjectives, other adverbs or complete sentences.
*Adverbs of manner describe how someone or something performs an, and answer the question "how?".

Indefinite time

JUST:

*To indicate that something has happened a very short time ago *It is used in **affirmative** sentences.

ALREADY:

*To indicate that something happened BEFORE we expected. *It is used in affirmative and interrogative sentences.

YET:

- *To express NEGATIVE ideas, indicate that something has not happened.
- *It is used in **interrogative forms**.
