Adverbs (Manner & Indefinite time)

Description

Manner

verb + adverb
She sings **beautifully**.

adverb + verb
He **gently** cut her hair.

subject + verb + object + adverb
They ate their food **slowly**.

verb + adverb + verb
We are **patiently** waiting for the cab.

Adjective - Adverb

soft -----> softly
careful -----> carefully
noise -----> noisily
beautiful -----> beautifully
gentle -----> gently
slow -----> slowly
patient -----> patiently ETC...

Some exceptions

good -----> well
fast -----> fast
hard -----> hard
late -----> late ETC...

Indefinite time

JUST:

- *To indicate that something has happened a very short time ago
- *It is used in **affirmative** sentences.

ALREADY:

- *To indicate that something happened BEFORE we expected.
- *It is used in **affirmative and interrogative** sentences.

YET:

- *To express NEGATIVE ideas, indicate that something has not happened.
- *It is used in **interrogative forms**.

subject + verb + object + adverb
