Future Will & Shall

Description

NORMAL FUTURE

- **When we talk about a prediction, a plan or expectations.**
- I & We ----> We use **SHALL**
- You, He, She It, You They ----> We use **WILL**

E.g.

- I **shall** write you a letter this summer.
- We **shall** go for a vacation this Summer, if it doesn't rain.
- She **will** hire a tutor for my examination.
- They **will** be late because of the bad weather

REMEMBER:

1. Always use **WILL** when is a REQUEST.
2. Always use **SHALL** when you OFFER something.
3. Always use **SHALL** when is a SUGGESTION.

STRONG FUTURE

- **Implies strong emotions, promise, a command or affirmed domination.**
- I & We ----> We use **WILL**
- You, He, She It, You They ----> We use **SHALL (To express a command or a promise)**

E.g.

- I **will** clear the interview.
- We **will not** win the match, but also the tournament.
- You **shall** no enter to the house without my permission.
- Rahul **shall** help you to solve the puzzle.

E.g. **Will** you help me with dinner?

E.g. **Shall** I help you with your homework?

Shall I take care of the baby while you're gone?

E.g. **Shall** we go out for dinner tonight?

Shall we go out for a ride?

GOLD RULE: If you ever get confused when to use will or shall, always prefer using **WILL**. However, if the statement is an offer, suggestion use **SHALL** instead.

EXTRA NOTES:

will = 'll

shall = 'll

S + shall/will + frequency adverb + verb infinitive + complement

frequency adverb (always, never, sometimes, etc)

EXTRA NOTES: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Remember that most of the time we use SHALL for questions.• We use SHALL or WILL when we offer to do things for other people [Shall I? / Will I?]• We use SHALL to suggest doing something. [Shall I? Shall we?]• It's common to use WILL with Think, Hope, Sure, Perhaps, etc.• We use WILL for promises.• We use WILL when we make decisions at the moment.• We use WILL to talk about things that we think will happen in the future.

<p>GOLD RULE: If you ever get confused when to use will or shall, always prefer using WILL. However, if the statement is an offer, suggestion use SHALL instead.</p>	

EXTRA NOTES:

- Remember that most of the time we use **SHALL** for questions.
- We use **SHALL** or **WILL** when we offer to do things for other people [Shall I? / Will I?]
- We use **SHALL** to suggest doing something. [Shall I? Shall we?]
- It's common to use **WILL** with Think, Hope, Sure, Perhaps, etc.
- We use **WILL** for promises.
- We use **WILL** when we make decisions at the moment.
- We use **WILL** to talk about things that we think will happen in the future.
