## How do we form the Present Perfect? (affirmative)

Subject + have + past participle + object

*I have cooked dinner.*



## Conjugating the Present Perfect (affirmative)

|               |             |             |                 |
|---------------|-------------|-------------|-----------------|
| <b>I</b>      | <b>have</b> | <b>seen</b> | <b>the film</b> |
| <b>You</b>    | <b>have</b> | <b>seen</b> | <b>the film</b> |
| <b>He/She</b> | <b>has</b>  | <b>seen</b> | <b>the film</b> |
| <b>We</b>     | <b>have</b> | <b>seen</b> | <b>the film</b> |
| <b>They</b>   | <b>have</b> | <b>seen</b> | <b>the film</b> |

## How do we form the Present Perfect? (negative)

Subject + have + not + past participle + object

*John has not fixed the sink.*

## How do we form the Present Perfect? (interrogative)

Have + subject + past participle + object

*Have you visited New York?*



## Conjugating the Present Perfect (interrogative)

|             |               |             |                   |
|-------------|---------------|-------------|-------------------|
| <b>Have</b> | <b>I</b>      | <b>seen</b> | <b>the film ?</b> |
| <b>Have</b> | <b>you</b>    | <b>seen</b> | <b>the film ?</b> |
| <b>Has</b>  | <b>he/she</b> | <b>seen</b> | <b>the film ?</b> |
| <b>Have</b> | <b>we</b>     | <b>seen</b> | <b>the film ?</b> |
| <b>Have</b> | <b>they</b>   | <b>seen</b> | <b>the film ?</b> |

## Contractions

## Describe unfinished time

E.g. I've worked as a teacher since 2011.

## Refer to indefinite time

E.g. I have seen the Eiffel Tower.

## Express experience or result

E.g. She has already watched this movie 3 times.

| <b>Have</b> | <b>they</b>   | <b>seen</b> | <b>the film?</b> |
