Subject + have + past participle + object

I have cooked dinner.



Conjugating the Present Perfect


I	have	seen	the film
You	have	seen	the film
He/She	has	seen	the film
We	have	seen	the film
They	have	seen	the film

Conjugating the Present Perfect

the film have not seen have not seen the film You He/She has the film not seen We not seen the film They the film

How do we form the Present Perfect?

Subject + have + not + past participle + object John has not fixed



How do we form the Present Perfect?

Have + subject + past participle + object

Have you visited New York?

Have	I	seen	the film?		
Have	you	seen	the film?		
Has	he/she	seen	the film?		
Have	we	seen	the film?		
Have	they	seen	the film?		

Contractions

have not = has not =

Describe unfinished time

E.g. I've worked as a teacher since 2011.

Refer to indefinite time

E.g. I have seen the Eiffel Tower.

Express experience or result

E.g. She has already watched this movie 3 times.

You	have	seen	the film
He/She	has	seen	the film
We	have	seen	the film
They	have	seen	the film

You	have	not	seen	the film
He/She	has	not	seen	the film
We	have	not	seen	the film
They	have	not	seen	the film
