## Zero Conditional

#### **Zero Conditional**

- \*Use it for facts that are generally true and don't change.
- \*It refers to a general situation that always happens if a conditional is met.
- \*The condition always has the same result.

#### E.g.:

If you leave chocolate in the sun, it melts.

If Condition, + Result
Result + if Condition

Affirmative (+) Negative (-) Interrogative (?)

#### Conditional 0

#### [AFFIRMATIVE]

## If + S + present simple, + C + S + present simple + C

## E.g. If I put water on the stove, it boils.

#### [NEGATIVE]

E.g. If I don't put the ice in the freezer, it doesn't freeze.

#### [INTERROGATIVE]

If I don't bring my umbrella, do I get wet?

**NOTE:** When the sentence starts with IF, use a comma to separate the 2 ideas, when IF is in the middle of the sentence, you don't use a comma.

E.g. If I leave chocolate in the sun, it melts. / Chocolate melts if I leave it in the sun.
