#### 1st Conditional

\*The first conditional is used to express the future consequence of a realistic possibility now or in the future.

E.g.:

If I study hard, I will pass the exam. I will pass the exam if I study hard.

**NOTE:** When the sentence starts with IF, use a comma to separate the 2 ideas, when IF is in the middle of the sentence, you don't use a comma.

E.g. **If** I go to Paris, I will visit The Eiffel Tower. / I will visit The Eiffel Tower **if** I go to Paris.

WHEN = IF If = maybe When = I will do it!
