If he **goes** to the party today, he **will be** tired tomorrow.



If Matt **doesn't finish** his work, the client **will not** pay him.



How **will** she **feel** if she **stays** at home?

1st Conditional

*The first conditional is used to express the future consequence of a realistic possibility now or in the future.

E.g.:

If I study hard, I will pass the exam.
I will pass the exam if I study hard.

NOTE: When the sentence starts with IF, use a comma to separate the 2 ideas, when IF is in the middle of the sentence, you don't use a comma.

E.g. **If** I go to Paris, I **will visit** The Eiffel Tower. / I **will visit** The Eiffel Tower **if** I go to Paris.

WHEN = IF If = maybe When = I will do it!

Affirmative (+)
Negative (-)
Interrogative (?)

Description

Conditional 1

[AFFIRMATIVE]

If + S + **present simple** , + C +
S + **will** + verb in infinitive + C

E.g. If I go to Paris, I will visit
The Eiffel Tower.

[NEGATIVE]

If + S + **present simple** , +
S + **will** + **not** +
verb infinitive + C

If + S + **does / do** + **not** , +
S + **will** + **not** +
verb infinitive + C

E.g. If I **don't** have money, I will not
go to the movies.

[INTERROGATIVE]

If + S + **present simple** ,
will + S + verb infinitive + C ?

If I pay attention to my
teacher, will I pass the course?

NOTE: When the sentence starts with IF, use a comma to separate the 2 ideas, when IF is in the middle of the sentence, you don't use a comma.

E.g. **If** I go to Paris, I **will visit** The Eiffel Tower. / I **will visit** The Eiffel Tower **if** I go to Paris.
