

Present Perfect Simple: Summary

Adverbs

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PRESENT PERFECT SIMPLE

[AFFIRMATIVE]

S + have/has + verb past participle + C

[NEGATIVE]

S + have/has + not + verb past part + C

have not = haven't has not = hasn't

[INTERROGATIVE]

Have/Has+ S + verb past part + C ?
