#### PRESENT PERFECT SIMPLE

#### [AFFIRMATIVE]

S + have/has + verb past participle + C

#### [NEGATIVE]

S + have/has + not + verb past part + C

have not = haven't has not = hasn't

#### [INTERROGATIVE]

Have/Has+ S + verb past part + C ?
