## Listening 2

In this part of the test, students will:

- identify cue words.
- identify distractors.
- listen for specific information.


## Start

- Write on the board the heading:


## Birthday Presents!!!

- Divide the class into two teams - play running writing (2 minutes).

One student from each team comes to the board and writes one word, then passes the marker to a friend and he / she will have to write another word.

It must be birthday present words only and students can't write any word the other team has in their section.
"If a word has been repeated, it must be crossed out in both sections."

## During

- Use the words students wrote to lable the presents:

Who is usually given each?
Ex.
Wallet - for men
Tie - for men
Football - for boys
CD - for boys and girls
Ticket for a concert - boys and girls
Clothes - girls
Etc.

- Divide the class into small groups - ask students to talk about:
the last birthday presents they got. the last birthday presents they gave.
- Write these questions on the board and invite some students to talk to the class - choose one section.

The last birthday present I got

What was it?
How did you like it?
How did you react?
Do you still have it?
Is it in a good condition?

The last birthday present I gave

Who did you give it to?
How much did it cost?
Where did you buy it?
Why did you choose it?
How did the person react when he / she received it?
"Try a game for participation."
Ex.
Hot potato
Magic sticks
Paper balls war
Numbering
Etc.

- Ask students to look at the activity on page 22 - students name the items.
- Ask students to think of two adjectives for each item.

Ex.
That's a green book.
That's a history book.

- Explain to students that they are going to hear two people talking about birthday presents - they must pay attention to / listen for specific information - what present each person gave to the boy.
- Listen and number the presents in the order you hear them. Then listen again and match them with a name.
- Whole class check by using the following chunk:

John gave the boy a ...

## Finish

- Ask students to write some examples / notes for further practice:

Ex.
The boy got: a jacket from Mary.
a history book from John.
a box of chocolates from Linda.
a fountain pen from Peter.
a camera from Vicky.
a pair of socks from James.
