Reading and Writing 2

In this part of the test, students will:

- identify parts of speech.
- analyse why two of the options are wrong.
- explain why the answer they chose is correct.

Parts of speech:

It's a category to which a word is assigned in accordance with its syntactic functions. In English, the main parts of speech are noun, pronoun, adjective, determiner, verb, adverb, preposition, conjunction, and interjection.

Part of speech:

It's one of the grammatical groups, such as noun, verb and adjective, into which words are divided depending on their use.

Cambridge Advanced Learner's Dictionary

Students must be able to identify distractors and explain why they don't fit in a gap.

Start

- Divide the class into small groups give each a white sheet of paper.
- Tell students to draw three columns and write the following words as headings:

noun

verb

adjective

Write some words on the board and ask students to write them in the correct columns.

During

- Write some sentences on the board and have students decide which part of speech is needed.
- Tell students to look at the words they wrote in the columns and choose the ones that fit the gaps.
- Explain to students that there are three aspects to take into account for this type of activity: grammar

context

meaning

- Ask students to read the example sentence on page 11 explain to them that the three options given seem to fit the gap but only one does.
- Ask students to find the ones that don't fit it ask them to explain why.

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Use students' ideas to further explain:

- incorrect answers
- correct answer

Finish

- Walk students through completing sentences 1 and 2. Then let students work in pairs (5 minutes).
- Check answers with the whole class remember, students must explain why an option fits / does not fit the gap.
