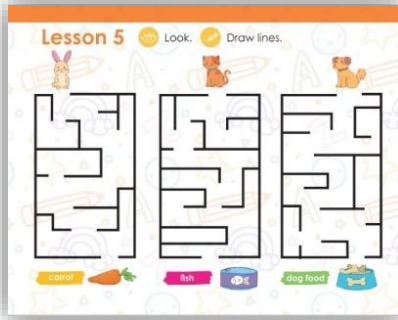


Awesome Kidz 1

Unit 6 Lesson 5



Aim: - Vocabulary focus: animals (rabbit, cat, dog) and food items (carrot, fish, dog food). Skills: Observing, drawing lines, and recognizing animals and their associated food

Time: 45-60 minutes

Materials:

- Pencils or crayons for tracing lines
- Small figurines or pictures of the rabbit, cat, and dog, along with their respective foods (carrot, fish, dog food)
- Toy maze or a printed maze on paper (optional, for additional practice)

Tip: Praise each child for their participation and effort. Acknowledging their work on the maze and matching activities builds confidence.

Engage:

- Begin by showing the children a figurine or picture of each animal (rabbit, cat, dog) and asking them, "Who is this?" After they identify the animal, ask, "What does the rabbit like to eat?" and continue with each animal.
- Display the matching food items (carrot, fish, dog food) for each animal, explaining, "The rabbit likes carrots, the cat likes fish, and the dog likes dog food!"

Story Introduction

- Tell a simple, playful story about each animal trying to find its food through a maze, like, "The rabbit is very hungry, but it's lost! Can you help it find its carrot?"

Explore & Practice:

With the book

- Give each child a crayon or pencil and ask them to help each animal find its food by drawing a line through the maze on the book page.
- Encourage them to focus and carefully trace the path for each animal. As they draw, have them say the names of the animal and its food (e.g., "Rabbit - carrot!") to reinforce vocabulary.

Maze Play

- If available, provide a small toy maze or draw a simple maze on paper. Let each child guide a small figurine of the animal through the maze, focusing on motor skills and patience.

- Guide them to say, "I'm helping the rabbit find the carrot," to practice vocabulary in context.

Closing:

Animal and Food Matching Game

- Show the pictures or figurines of the animals and their foods, and have the children match each animal to its food. Hold up the rabbit and ask, "What does the rabbit eat?" to reinforce the association.

Goodbye Song

- Sing a simple goodbye song that includes each animal and its food, like, "Goodbye, little rabbit, enjoy your carrot. Goodbye!" This song helps reinforce vocabulary in a fun, memorable way.
